

**BOWLERS WILL BE GAME CHANGERS IN THE WORLD CUP: MALINGA**

LONDON: Batsmen may be constantly propelling their teams to high scores everyday but Sri Lanka veteran pacer Lasith Malinga believes that the bowlers will be the "game changers" in the upcoming World Cup despite the flowing runs. "Cricket is going towards the batsmen but bowlers can change the game, they get the wickets and that wins a match," Malinga was quoted as saying by ICC Media after Sri Lanka's five-wicket defeat to Australia in their second warm-up game at Southampton on Monday night. "Whoever has the skilful bowlers, in any condition on any pitch, will have the advantage in the team. Bowlers need to have a skill, then know how to analyse a game."

ROBERTO FIRMINO WILL BE FINE FOR FINAL, SAYS KLOPP

LONDON: Liverpool manager Jurgen Klopp has said that Brazilian striker Roberto Firmino should be fit to face Tottenham Hotspur in Saturday's UEFA Champions League final in Madrid. Firmino missed Liverpool's memorable semi-final win over Barcelona and the final game of the Premier League season against Wolverhampton Wanderers with a muscle strain, but he has responded well to his return to training according to Klopp. "Bobby was part of training last week, then we took him out and will be in training from tomorrow again. From what we saw so far he looked good. He will be fine, I'm sure."

**Sourav, Laxman conflict verdicts likely on Sachin's line: BCCI**

NEW DELHI: With the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) Ombudsman D K Jain dismissing charges of conflict against Sachin Tendulkar, board officials believe the same course of action is likely in the cases of the two other members of the Cricket Advisory Committee (CAC) — Sourav Ganguly and VVS Laxman. The three had been questioned for holding positions in the CAC as well as working with IPL franchises.

While Madhya Pradesh Cricket Association life member Sanjeev Gupta had raised questions of conflict against Tendulkar and Laxman, Ganguly's position was brought to Jain's notice by Bengal-based cricket fans — Bhawati Shantua, Abhijeet Mukherjee and Ranjit Seal. A senior BCCI official said that not just Tendulkar, none of the CAC members were given terms of reference by the Committee of Administrators (CoA).

So, it was likely that both Laxman and Ganguly would also be freed of any charges of conflict. "No terms of reference were ever communicated to any of the members of the CAC by the CoA and therefore on this set of facts the verdict regarding the others is also likely to be same as Sachin's verdict," the official said.

Tendulkar's legal team had earlier said: "(He/Tendulkar)

wishes to reiterate that he has been requesting the BCCI since the inception of the CAC that the terms of reference and his tenure be furnished to him.

"He has requested this repeatedly and several times over the years including as recently as December 7, 2018. He is now left with no other choice but to communicate to BCCI that until and unless the BCCI furnishes the terms of reference and tenure of his appointment in CAC, he has decided to not be part of any committee of the BCCI including CAC."

While Jain is yet to give his verdict with regards to Laxman and Ganguly, in Tendulkar's case, the ombudsman wrote: "In my view, in the light of the afore extracted statement made on behalf of Sachin Tendulkar, (...) the issue of whether there is any 'conflict of interest' on part of Tendulkar does not arrive and the ethics officer need not go into the said allegation." Tendulkar had also hinted at the lack of clarity from the CoA with regards to the functioning of the CAC in his letter to Jain. "On December 7, 2018, we had written to the Committee of Administrators requesting them to clarify the scope of our role and responsibilities. To this date, there has been no reply," Laxman's legal team had written.

KOHLI'S DISMISSAL WAS AGAINST THE RUN OF PLAY & IT WAS A CASE OF OVER ATTACKING

Dhoni, Rahul hit tons as India score 359/7

CARDIFF: A new day, but it was the same old story for the Indian top-order as the overcast conditions got the better of the much-famed batting line-up in their warm-up game against Bangladesh in Cardiff. While New Zealand had gone for the kill after snuffing blood, the Bangladesh bowlers couldn't manage the same as the Indians finished on 359/7 in their 50 overs, riding on a brilliant century by K L Rahul and a dominant 113 by old warhorse M S Dhoni.

Keeping aside those two knocks and the quickfire 46-ball 47 from skipper Virat Kohli, it was again a case of conditions making the batsmen sweat. While ODI deputy Rohit Sharma managed 19, opening partner Shikhar Dhawan scored just 1.

In fact, it almost looked like the Dhoni of old as he used the depth of the crease to perfection against the Bangladesh spinners.

But then, these warm-up matches are to fine-tune the areas that need attention. And going by the form of the Indian batsmen in the top half, there is plenty to worry for skipper Kohli and coach Ravi Shastri.

Dhawan was the first to go as he was trapped plumb in front after he planted his foot across the line of the ball from Mustafizur Rahman.

His worry with the one that leaves the left-hander was clearly behind his undoing in this case. In case of Rohit, it has to be more of disappoint-



ment and frustration at the way he chopped one onto his stumps due to his inability to read the slowness of the ball. Trying a pull off the front foot, he looked to have played the shot a tad bit early.

Kohli's dismissal was against the run of play and it was a case of over attacking. While it is no justification, but then, Kohli's form is definitely not a worry when it comes to adapting to English conditions.

But Shankar's typical dismissal behind the wicket off pacer Rubel Hossain will definitely be a cause for concern. Trying to play at one too close to leave, all Shankar managed was an edge to the keeper.

But every dark cloud has a silver lining and on Tuesday, it was Dhoni putting up a brilliant show of batmanship as he first guided Rahul and then went into a zone as he sent the Bangladesh bowlers on a leather hunt in the death overs.

It was only poetic justice that he brought up his 100 with a six in the 49th over of the innings as skipper Kohli cheered on from the dressing room with teammates for company.

Steyn ruled out of opener vs England

LONDON: South African paceman Dale Steyn has been ruled out of Thursday's World Cup opener against England, with the Proteas coach Ottis Gibson saying the pace great is "getting closer" to full recovery from a shoulder injury. Gibson's words left no doubts that the 35-year-old, South Africa's highest wicket-taker in Tests, has still not gained match fitness. He had sustained the shoulder injury during his short stint in the IPL. "He is getting closer everyday. We hope that if not by Sunday (against Bangladesh) then by the India game [on 5 June] (he will be ready)," Gibson said at a press conference.
